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### ***Client Notes for Baby Boy Campbell for 06/10/09: Baby Boy's Weight: 2.13 Lbs***

Baby Boy is maintaining his weight at 2.13 pounds. His temperature is slightly higher than last week but still within the acceptable range for a hyper, squirmy kitten (103 F). He has the discharge from the eyes and nose as noted last week. His lungs sound slightly congested (unlike last week).

All the above signs confirm his upper respiratory infection (URI). Most URI are self-limiting but since he is not improving, we will start him on oral antibiotic to avoid secondary bacterial infection / pneumonia. Start the oral antibiotic this evening:

Rx: Clavamox Drops --- Give 0.5 ml by mouth twice daily for 2 weeks. Antibiotic. Keep Refrigerated and Shake Well..tnt

\*\*\* Discontinue medication and call us if any GI upset such as vomiting or diarrhea.

As we discussed, since you are trying to adopt him out (not keeping him), we are treating him supportively for the URI. We have not done any diagnostics / tests yet. If no improvement, we need to pursue diagnostics, starting with the blood test (FeLV / FIV) and possible chest radiographs.

Clean his nose of discharge several times a day as needed. May need to add on nose drops if nasal discharge worsens.

Please call with an update in 3-5 days; sooner if any problems or concerns.

Follow-up in 2 weeks if he is still with you..tnt
